Speaker Bios

Dr. Paul L. Weygandt, J. A. Thomas & Associates

Arriving in Pittsburgh for his training he completed internship and residency in Internal Medicine in 1972, interrupted by service in the United States Air Force. While there he served as a flight surgeon and Chief of Aerospace Medicine at the USAF Regional Hospital, Westover AFB, attaining the rank of Major. Returning to Pittsburgh he completed an NIH fellowship in Endocrinology and Metabolism. He is Board certified in both Internal Medicine and Endocrinology, and a Fellow of both the American College of Physicians and the American College of Endocrinology.

On finishing his training, he went into private practice though geographical full time at Magee-Womens Hospital, where he served as Associate Chief of Medicine. He established and supervised a residency rotation for senior medical residents in Medical Complications of Pregnancy from 1974 through 2003. Appointed to the faculty at University of Pittsburgh at the outset he has attained the rank of Clinical Professor of Medicine. Following a time with UPMC's Community Medicine, Inc., he joined the Washington Hospital Physician Services Organization practicing consultative Endocrinology and served as Medical Director of the Diabetes Education and Management Program. He is currently the principal of Endocrine-Metabolic Consultants.

Dr. Schmeltz co-chaired the Diabetes Working Group of the Pittsburgh Regional Health Initiative and is currently a member of its Board of Directors. He chaired the Diabetes Management Program of UPMC Health Plan from 1999 through 2003, and served as a member of the advisory board of the University of Pittsburgh Diabetes Institute, and Co Chair of the Diabetes Working Group of the Pittsburgh Regional Healthcare Initiative (2000-2004). From 1995 through 2003 he was vice Chair and Medical Director of University Physicians Practice Association, as well as the Chair of UPMC Health Plan's Credentials Committee. He serves on the Quality Advisory Committee for Highmark Blue Cross/Blue Shield.

He is a former president of the Pennsylvania Endocrine Society and is a past president of the Pennsylvania Society of Internal Medicine. He served on the Board of Governors of the American College of Physicians. While ACP Governor for Western PA, he also chaired the chapter's Health and Public Policy Committee for 7 years. In 2005, he was honored with the College's Pressman Award as the Outstanding Internist in Pennsylvania. Elected as the Internal Medicine Trustee on the Board of the Pennsylvania Medical Society, in 2002, he is a member of their Patient Safety Committee and chairs the State of Medicine Task Force. He was elected Vice President in 2008 and currently serves as President.
